WHO AM I?

Like many of us today, the people of first century Ephesus were confronted by a narrative that engaged in questions around identity. Ephesus was a political centre. It was the Roman capital of Asia, a busy trade port and a cultural centre known for its beautiful architecture. Power sat at the heart of the city. It was also a deeply spiritual city. Ephesus was famous for its temple to Diana (or Artemis), one of the seven ancient wonders of the world. The cultic worship of this figure of fertility celebrated various forms of personal and sexual expression. That is how their identity was shaped. Ultimately, the demand for every Roman Citizen was to declare 'Caesar is Lord'. For those in Ephesus, identity was profoundly wrapped in the social, cultural, political, and religious practices of the city.

Into this space Paul writes, from prison in Rome, to the church in Ephesus that the Christian identity was located in a different king and a difference community. It is clear in Paul's letter to the Ephesian church that their identity was not to be found in the surrounding culture, or in Caesar, but 'in Christ'. And to be in Christ changes everything. It changes where power is located. It changes where love is to be found. It changes where joy is to be found. It changes what community you are to be found in. It changes where morality is to be found. And the good news of this new identity is that it is something bestowed upon us, graciously given to us through the wonderful redeeming work of Christ.

EPHESIANS 1

Who am I? I am chosen

False Identity: I choose...my own identity and am responsible for cultivating it.

Application

Ask: What spiritual blessings do you see at work in your life?

Ask: What implications does being adopted into God's family have for our lives?

Ask: What is His pleasure and will for your life? What would you say your purpose in life is?

Pray: For your perspective to grow that you may see yourself and those around you as chosen by God and called with purpose.

I am saved

EPHESIANS 2

All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved.

Ephesians 2:3-5

Using the SOAP method, reflect on the entire chapter or the selected passage above.

Scripture - write down the verse that stood out to you.

Observation - what is the author saying? What does this tell you about God, yourself and the world in which we live?

Application - what is one thing from these verses that you can apply to your life today?

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Who am I? I am saved

True Identity: I am saved...forgiven and free. It is a gift that cannot be earned but received

False Identity: I am slaved...trapped in my past shame no matter how hard I try to escape.

Application

Ask: Paul says, we are dead in our sin. While this is a hard truth, why is it important that we acknowledge and confess this?

Ask: How do you define grace? Share how you've seen God's grace in your life.

Ask: Paul also says 'we are God's handiwork.' Spend some time encouraging one another around the unique characteristics you see in each other.

Pray: That you would continue to live by grace and not by works, and for those in your life you wish to be saved by grace.

I am loved

EPHESIANS 3

I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Ephesians 3:16-19

Using the SOAP method, reflect on the entire chapter or the selected passage above.

Scripture - write down the verse that stood out to you.

Observation - what is the author saying? What does this tell you about God, yourself and the world in which we live?

Application - what is one thing from these verses that you can apply to your life today?

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Who am I? I am loved

True Identity: I am loved...because of my position.

False Identity: I am loved...because of my **performance.**

Application

Ask: Describe what being 'rooted and established in love' looks like for you in your everyday life.

Ask: How often do you slip into finding your worth in what you do rather than who you are as a beloved child of God?

Ask: What practices/disciplines can you start to be sure you keep coming back to the foundation of 'I am loved'?

Pray: For an increase in love in your life group, family, workplace, our church, your neighbourhood and beyond.

I am family

EPHESIANS 4

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all...

Ephesians 4:2-5

Who am I? I am family

Pray: That we would continue to grow in unity as one big church family.

I am holy

EPHESIANS 5

Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Ask: Why does Paul say that making the most of every opportunity is wise? What might these opportunities look like and how can you seek them out?

Ask: Why is personal holiness so important to life with Jesus?

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WHO AM I? I AM CHOSEN

True Identity: I am sent...on a mission with a purpose to serve and share the good news of Jesus.

False Identity: I am self...serving my needs is the most important thing to me.

Application

Ask: If Paul was writing about the Armour of God in today's context, what examples might he use instead?

Ask: What are some examples of rulers, authorities, powers and spiritual forces we fight against today?

Ask: What focuses you to keep looking outward to serve, rather than inward to your own selfish desires?

Pray: That we would be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power to be sent to share the good news wherever we go.
